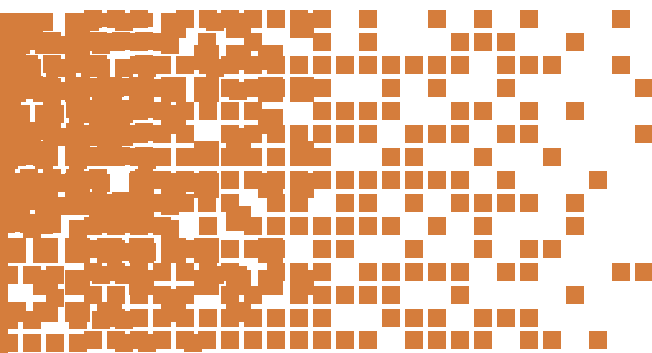


Small-Scale producers and international trade: What role for a re-imagined Agreement on Agriculture?



Join the conversation in Yaoundé, Cameroon, on the occasion of the World Trade Organization's 14th Ministerial Conference.

At the session, speakers will set out the challenges and opportunities for small-scale producers in the multilateral trade system and their local contexts. Our focus will be to consider fresh approaches to traditional trade rules for fairer, more resilient, and sustainable agricultural trade. We will present a proposal for reimagined trade rules that support sustainable and resilient food systems globally.

Participants are invited to engage with a proposed draft treaty that could replace the WTO Agreement on Agriculture, built on new principles designed to address 21st-century challenges. We will ask you to reflect on the practical implications for small-scale producers and the steps needed to bring about reform.
